- **Expand** the student's experience and awareness of diverse future pathways.
- **Evolve** continuously to support lifelong learning and development.

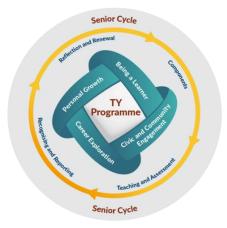

Overview of the TY Programme Statement

Student Dimensions

The 4 Student Dimensions are the key foundations upon which TY Programmes are designed. They describe how students can develop in TY and the experiences that can support this development.

Personal Growth:

- · Develops social and emotional maturity
- Focuses on health, wellbeing, autonomy, identity, empathy and leadership

Being a Learner:

- Encourages motivation and enjoyment in learning
- Develops digital skills, lifelong learning appreciation and independent learning

Civic and Community Engagement:

- Promotes active citizenship and community involvement
- Encourages sustainable living and cultural appreciation

Career Exploration:

- Provides career guidance and workplace experience
- · Develops vocational and organisational skills

Student experiences are intended to provide a variety of possible opportunities and contexts to support student learning and development consistent with the developmental indicators.

Developmental indicators are intended to guide the student and the school and set out the parameters for the learning and development of the student during TY.

The student experiences in the Transition Year Programme Statement are not intended to be exhaustive but to offer guidance to schools in their planning and in laying the foundations for their TY Programme. The developmental indicators set out the parameters for learning and development.

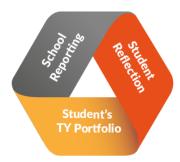
